
## French Drama

The first edition of Arnault's verse tragedy which premiered at the Comédie in March 1817. A major riot erupted at the theatre as Arnault, (as a close friend of Napoleon), was then in exile and his supporters seized the opportunity to demonstrate for his return. The following day *Germanicus* was banned.





Despite professing herself on the brink of death in each letter, Maria reached the venerable age of 83!
